

From the moment I opened this book I was entranced by its luxuriant pictures. Catala, the director of an aquarium in New Caledonia, has used his resources well to provide us with a glimpse of many organisms that the vast majority of us will never see otherwise. Specimens range from the common to the extremely rare, and his coverage of the various marine life groups is well balanced. The accompanying text is very informative, although his humor is slightly erratic. Unfortunately, the text doesn't follow the same sequence as the pictures, and often there are a couple pages to flip in order to reference a figure. Its slightly annoying, but the sheer number and quality of the photographs makes up for it. All in all, this book is an amazing reference for anyone who wants to see the extraordinarily diverse types of animals in our oceans, as well as those interested in tropical marine life.
